NDTS 2024. Christians gathered for worship at this year's National Day Thanksgiving Service (NDTS) on 15 August to mark Singapore's 59th birthday just three weeks after the 50th Anniversary celebrations of NCCS on 24 July. While giving thanks to God for Singapore, NCCS leaders prayed for the church, the nation and a troubled world. The congregation was blessed by the anthem of choral group Cantate Domino and the musical item by the handbell ringers from Toa Payoh Methodist Church. Offerings for the evening went to the NCCS 50th Anniversary project for two charities. Many worshippers stayed for fellowship over light refreshments after the service. We were also encouraged by the attendance of Deputy Prime Minister Gan Kim Yong and Mrs Gan, as well as cabinet ministers and members of parliament.

Rt Rev Dr Christopher Chia, Vice-President of NCCS preached on "Christ, Culture and Country" based on 1 Peter 2: 9-12. Rev Chia began his sermon by welcoming the congregation and inviting them to wish each other a "Blessed National Day". He then highlighted the theme of the sermon – how God's people relate to Christ, Culture and Country in a world that rejects Christ. He asked the congregation if we ever felt alienated because of our belief and choices as Christians? Whether this has happened to our children in school? Or in our places of work?

He went on to relate to the context of 1 Peter. The early Christians lived at a time of Roman rule when Christianity was an "illegal" religion. Emperor worship was the state religion, and while Judaism was an accepted religion, Christians were rejected and were considered the "scum of the earth". In this environment Peter addresses his letter to the "elect exiles" – a term of significance to describe Christians. How could the "elect" be "exiles" at the same time? He noted that Christians need to have a "bifocal" view of life. We are the "elect" because we are chosen by God to live for Him. Yet in a world that rejects Christ we will be treated as exiles – alienated and rejected.
