NCCS Exco Update We thank Col Hary Haran, who retired his appointment as Territorial Commander of The Salvation Army for Singapore, Malaysia and Myanmar, for his contributions to NCCS through the Executive Committee. Upon his retirement, we welcome Col Richard Borrett, the new regional head of The Salvation Army who joined the Exco on 21 August. Col Borrett comes from his previous postings as Territorial Commander for the United Kingdom and Ireland, and for Eastern Europe. This is his first appointment in Singapore and Asia. The Salvation Army is a Founder Member of NCCS.

Celebrate Christmas in Singapore For the past 21 years, Celebrate Christmas in Singapore (CCIS) has united churches and Christian organisations in a shared mission to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the heart of Orchard Road — Singapore's bustling shopping district and one of the city's most visited tourist destinations. This initiative presents a unique opportunity that the Lord has graciously entrusted to the Church in Singapore to serve as his ambassadors, bringing the message of hope and salvation to people from all walks of life.

The annual budget for CCIS is \$350,000, and a fundraising dinner was held on 9 September to support this vision. The goal is to raise one-third of the total budget through this and another event. CCIS (a member of NCCS) still has a long way to go to meet the budget. We encourage you to prayerfully consider supporting CCIS and its mission.
